I would like to express my deep appreciation to all of you for taking part in the 14th Oku Memorial Trophy rugby match. This event is held in memory of Ambassador Katsuhiko Oku who, while serving as Director of the Japan Information and Cultural Centre (JICC) at our Embassy in London, was tragically killed in the line of duty in 2003 during a reconstruction mission in Iraq. "Katsu", as he was called by his friends, was driven not only by his work for the international community but also by his enthusiasm for deepening Japan's partnerships with other countries through sport.
